Definition of *fear*

(Entry 1 of 2)

1a: an unpleasant often strong emotion caused by anticipation or awareness of danger

b(1): an instance of this emotion

(2): a state marked by this emotion

2: anxious concern : SOLICITUDE

4: reason for alarm : DANGER

Definition of *fear* (Entry 2 of 2)

transitive verb
1: to be afraid of : expect with alarmfear the worst

2: to have a reverential awe of fear God

3*archaic* : FRIGHTEN

4archaic : to feel fear in (oneself)

intransitive verb

: to be afraid or apprehensive feared for their lives feared to go out at night

As we look at each scripture associated, let's remember the questions that help us understand:

Observation Questions

- 1. Who is talking or being talked about?
- 2. What is the subject or topic being discussed?
- 3. What comes before and what follows after?
- 4. Where/When/Why is the activity taking place?
- 5. How are the people involved responding?

Make observations of the text using the observation questions.
